In late July, the House and Senate passed, and the president signed, a two-year deal on increasing budget caps and suspending the debt limit. As of October 1, the beginning of Fiscal Year (FY) 2020, the House has passed 10 of its 12 appropriations bills. The Senate has not passed any but has passed several through its Appropriations Committee. A short-term funding bill was enacted in late September keeping the federal government running at FY 2019 levels through November 21 to give Congress time to work out a spending deal on these various funding measures and avoid a government shutdown.

**A minimal amount of funding would be provided to begin closing the agency. No new grants would be awarded.*

***The Senate Appropriations Committee released a proposal for the Labor-HHS-Education and Related Agencies bill, which includes funding for IMLS, but has not acted on it.*
